The MDE School Finance Award

The School Finance Award was created and monitored by several people in the Program Finance Division at the Minnesota Department of Education. The intent of the award was to continue to highlight the importance of compliance with the law as well as provide a method to motivate reporting units to strive to greater levels of compliance, sound accounting and training. It was simply a way to recognize good work and “post the model.”

There were 170 units that earned the award in one or more years since its inception in FY 2003. Mankato earned the award every year for eight straight years. There were 11 winners or 2% of all the reporting units that first year. Each year the award was clarified and got more rigorous. More criteria were added or tightened in each of the past several years. The bar continued to rise. Yet, the award winners for FY 2010 increased over the prior years.

There were a total of 126 winners or 22.45% of the 561 reporting units for FY 2010. There were 19 new entries to the winners list this year. Of the 126 winners this year, 55 of 158 units or 35% were charter schools, 68 of 340 units or 20% were traditional school districts, and 3 of 63 units were regional or intermediate units.

The list of winners is also punctuated by districts or schools that were in Statutory Operating Debt in past years. There were 19 units that removed the condition of SOD and went on to earn the coveted School Finance Award. They as well as the others received the specially designed certificate and a signed letter of congratulations from the commissioner.

The names of all the winning units are posted to the web each year and given recognition at several events including those hosted by the Minnesota School Boards Association, the Minnesota Association of School Administrators, the Minnesota Association of Charter Schools and the Minnesota Association of Business Officials.
