- 3. 2019 Summer Programs, Kim Carlson, Director of Community Education Targeted Services enrollment is increasing. Have received 542 referrals for this summer's programming. Targeted Services and all Buffalo KidKare Programs will be held at Northwinds Elementary this year. Will continue the ECFE Tuesdays in the park and swim lessons at the BCMS pool and Pulaski beach. Various camps are being offered for tennis, football, basketball, volleyball and gymnastics and enrichment classes will include a Virtualy Reality Experience and Kids Chef Camp. Applying to have Northwinds Elementary included as an approved site for the USDA Summer Food Program.
- 4. SPED Extended School Year 2019, Amy Ernst, Director of Special Education Services are provided to eligible students who currently receive special education services. Program will be held at BCMS this year. 115 K-21 aged students are eligible along with 44 3-5 year olds.
