Have you ever heard of the idea of having a "Growth Mindset"? Also, as we move forward, we are also brainstorming ways that we can safely have a "Drive Through" closure to our school year where we can say "Have a good summer!" to each other, collect materials, and have closure to the school year in June - I will keep you posted on this!

I get emotional when I think about it, but we have such a great thing going at Discovery and I couldn't be more proud to be a part of the great work we all do, together, for our students.
