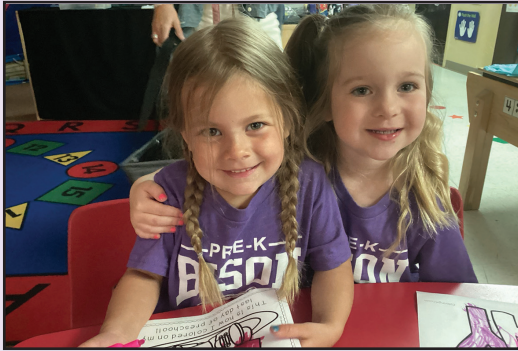
COMMUNITY PARTNERS

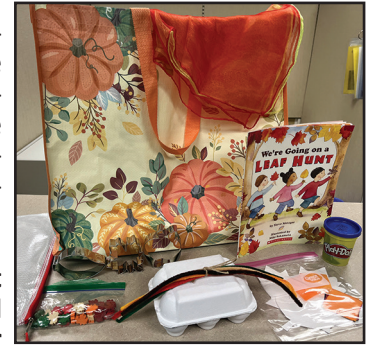



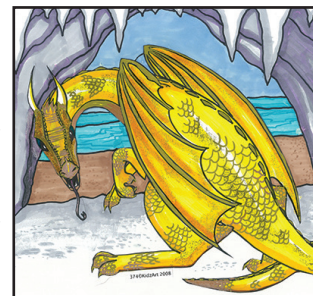

SWIMMING LESSONS FOR KIDS

American Red Cross Learn to Swim program offers comprehensive levels to teach students how to swim skillfully and safely. The pre-requisite for each level is the successful demonstration of skills from the preceding level. Note: The shallow end of our pool is 42" deep. **Therefore, children must be 52" in height and at least 6 years old to participate in levels 1-5.** Children under 52" in height should enroll in the Preschool program. Each level of Learn to Swim includes basic water safety and helping a swimmer in distress.

Parent & Child Aquatics (6 mo to 3 yrs) \$69
