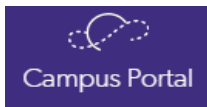

2021-2022 Flu Season Update

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has indicated the flu season is just getting started (typically runs October-May; peaking between December and February). Per the CDC, it's not too late to get vaccinated. Flu vaccination is always the best way to prevent flu and its potentially serious complications. If you and your children have not had a current vaccination for influenza, you may want to contact your healthcare provider to determine if your family should receive a flu shot. It is not too late!!

Save the Date: *Give Kids a Smile* February 4th and 5th

Each year, dental professionals from across the state participate in *Give Kids a Smile*, providing free dental care to low-income children in need. No eligibility questions are asked. The event takes place on the first Friday and Saturday of February and is made possible by the collaborative effort of the Minnesota Dental Association, volunteer dentists, and other generous sponsors. Registration began January 1, 2022. Parents can find local participating clinics by visiting mndental.org or by calling United Way 2-1-1 or 1-800-543-7709. United Way also provides assistance and translation services in Hmong, Somali and Spanish Monday-Friday 8am-5pm; they can help answer questions and set up appointments. *Please note: Every child must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian and must have an appointment in advance. Walk-in care is not available.*
