Mr. Mischke's Message

Like all other Minnesota school districts, BHS has important state testing coming up for students this spring, primarily in March and April. We pride ourselves in our strong academic focus, excellent teaching staff, and exceptional students at BHS and want our students to put their best efforts into a positive testing experience this spring; we engage in comprehensive communication with families in order to support this. The test scores earned by our BHS students are important for a number of reasons. Although we know that the scores serve as just one point of data, they help our teaching and administrative staff gauge how our students are learning, how well academic standards are being taught, and where learning gaps can exist. Potential and current families can view the published test scores to determine district interest, as well as gauge their student's progress. The state utilizes the scores to determine how well districts are teaching standards, and when students opt out of the tests, they are considered "not proficient" by the state, thereby negatively impacting the overall school test scores for BHS. Students can access free MCA test prep resources at <http://minnesota.pearsonaccessnext.com/> (click on Preparing for Testing and then Item Samplers).

On April 7th, all 10th grade students will take the MCA Reading test, while all 11th graders who choose to opt-in will take the ACT test. **9th grade and 12th grade students will not attend school on April 7th, 2020.** The ACT Opt-In Form was sent to all BHS families earlier this month; the deadline to sign up is February 28, 2020. In order to support our 10th and 11th grade students in achieving higher MCA and ACT scores, we will be offering MCA prep and ACT prep during advisory sessions in March.

Here is a reminder of the dates of upcoming testing at BHS:

- March 3-6: MCA Math, 11th grade
- March 17-19 and May 4-8: MCA Science, all students taking Biology in 2019-2020
- April 7: ACT Test, 11th grade, and MCA Reading, 10th grade

Our 3rd term **Parent/Teacher Conferences will be held on Monday, February 24th, from 5:00-8:00 p.m.** in the BHS cafeteria. This is a wonderful opportunity for you to connect in person with your student's teachers and advisors to make sure your student is on the right track.

As a parent, community member, and educator I am so proud of the work we are able to do everyday, and I am honored to have the opportunity to continue to serve as the Principal at BHS.



ACT & ACT Test Prep

The ACT Plus Writing college entrance exam will be given during the school day on Tuesday, April 7th, 2020 at Buffalo High School to 11th grade students only. There will be **no cost** to students for this exam and scores may be used for college admission testing requirements (at individual college's discretion). Students are able to send their score reports to up to four colleges for free during the pre-registration process that will take place at BHS in March. Encourage your student to start thinking about where they might like to send their score.



Students have been preparing for this exam throughout their education and will be tested in the areas of English, math, reading, science, and writing. Some students may wish to do extra preparation before taking the ACT Plus Writing if they have specific score goals. Preparation materials can be found through multiple vendors and publishers as well as at most public libraries.

Free online prep course and practice tests are available through the Minnesota Career Information System (www.mncis.intocareers.org) for all BHS students. See your school counselor for details.

Free ACT prep guides are available in the Student Services Office.

Important Immunization and Health Updates From the BHS Health Office

For the 2020-2021 school year, the Minnesota Department of Health added a new immunization requirement for 12th grade students. The requirement states, "students entering 12th grade need to have documentation or a legal exemption for the booster dose of meningococcal vaccine (most students received the initial dose of this vaccine when they entered 7th grade)". Teenagers and young adults are at higher risk for meningococcal disease. This dose is important to make sure they are fully protected through their highest risk years.

If you have questions about your student's current immunizations on file with the school please see the parent portal and click on "health" to review your student's current immunization record. Please call the Health Office at (763) 682-8121 if you have any questions or if you would like an exemption form.

This winter, during flu and cold season, we have seen an increase in absences due to illness. Please continue to encourage your teen to stay healthy by washing their hands often, covering their cough/sneeze, and maintaining good hydration (8-10 8oz cups of water is a good goal). Aim for 8-10 hours of sleep each night and stay home when ill.



Buffalo High School Principal Mark Mischke said, "We are so appreciative of the support Wright



Spring Testing at BHS



A phone call and corresponding email went out in early February regarding Spring testing at BHS beginning in early March.

- All BHS 11th graders will take the MCA, or Minnesota Comprehensive Assessment, Math test in the window of March 3rd-6th.
- BHS students enrolled in Biology during semester 1 will take the MCA Science test in the window of March 17th-19th.
- On April 7th, all 10th grade students will take the MCA Reading test, while all 11th graders who choose to opt-in will take the ACT test. **9th grade and 12th grade students will not attend school on this day.**

- BHS students enrolled in Biology during semester 2 will take the MCA Science test in the window of May 4th-8th.


Families of 11th graders received additional information on how to Opt-In for the ACT Test. The ACT Plus Writing Test is being offered, free of charge, to all of BHS juniors on Tuesday, April 7th, 2020. Juniors no longer need to complete this test for their State

Graduation Requirement; however, we are strongly encouraging that all of our juniors take advantage of this free opportunity to take the ACT.

Juniors who wish to opt in and take the ACT Test on April 24th will need to have a parent/guardian complete the Opt-In form that was distributed.

A response is required of all families. Email reminders have been sent to parents/guardians who have not yet completed the opt-in.
