

Two Options for Taking the Class D Knowledge Test

Request to Take the Test Online

Beginning October 8, 2020, Minnesotans can submit their request to take the **Class D Knowledge Test** online by completing these steps:

1. Go to **drive.mn.gov** and select, **Take a Class D Knowledge Test**
2. Follow the prompts. Name, date of birth and social security number are required
3. DPS-DVS will send an email to the email address provided during registration with the following information:
 - a. A link to the at home online Knowledge Test site
 - b. Test ticket number
 - c. Unique security code
 - d. Testing and proctor instructions (Proctors must be 21 years or older and hold a valid Minnesota drivers license. Proctors must agree they will not provide assistance while proctoring the test.)
 - e. The test ticket number and security code will be needed to log in to the online **Knowledge Testing Site**
 - f. Once a person registers for the online Knowledge Test, they have 72 hours to take the test

Taking the Test online at Home:

- Online testing will be available Monday through Saturday, 6 am-11 pm
- Once a person logs in to the testing site they have 30 minutes to complete the test before it will time out
- When the test is complete, DPS-DVS records the test results in the driver services system
- If the student passes the test, the applicant should complete the pre-application online at **drive.mn.gov** before visiting a county office to complete their driver's permit application. Bring your **Certificate of Enrollment (Blue Card)** proving you completed classroom instruction)
- If the student fails the test, the applicant must follow DPS-DVS guidelines and restart the process to retake the test again. A person can only take one test per day and is only eligible to complete two test attempts online. The student will need to schedule an appointment for a third test attempt at an open exam station and pay \$10 fee

Schedule an In-Person Appointment

1. Go to **drive.mn.gov**
2. Select **Schedule or Reschedule an Exam**
3. Follow the prompts

Come Prepared

Minnesotans will be required to complete a wellness screening before entering the exam station and should come prepared. Visit **dps.mn.gov** for more information or to submit questions using the **driver services contact forms**.

- Wear a face mask (required)
- Bring required documents
- Know your social security number
- Bring check, cash or money order to pay the Instruction Permit Fee or retesting fee, if applicable
- You must be at least 15 years old
- Bring your **Certificate of Enrollment (Blue Card)** proving you completed classroom instruction
- A parent, court-appointed guardian, county-appointed foster parent or the director of the transitional living program you reside in will need to come with to sign and approve your application
- If completed, bring the **Supplemental Parental Curriculum Completion Certificate** from a Parent and Student Safety Meeting you attended
