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Mr. Mischke's Message

"Doing What's Best for ALL Kids" is the mission of Buffalo High School. It has been, and will continue to be the driving force behind the work we do everyday at BHS. As things will look different this year for students, staff and families, our mission remains the same. We realize that we are in a historically challenging time as we work to provide the best educational experience possible for our students, and we know that we will need to work together to overcome these challenges. In order for us to work together it is essential that we continuously communicate how we are working to reach our mission of "Doing What's Best for ALL Kids" at BHS. We believe that our work starts with the focus of building connections with our students and helping them to build connections with each other. This work is reflected in our two main building goals.

Buffalo High School Goals:

Goal #1: 100% of our students report that they have an adult that they can go to if they have a problem.

*2019-20 BHS results: 93% - National results: 54%

Goal #2: 100% of our students report that they feel supported by other students at BHS. *2019-20 BHS results: 87% - National results: 33%

We survey our students every spring and have gathered results annually over the last 13 years. The results from last spring were the *highest percentages we have ever achieved*. Thank you to our staff for their tireless efforts in connecting with our students, and thank you as parents/guardians for your work to keep your student connected to school. We truly believe that in order for students to be successful they need to feel connected to our staff and each other.

As you look at comparisons to what other students are saying across the nation, you can see the work is now more important than ever. We will need your help as parents/guardians in taking the next steps in reaching 100%. Please stay connected to your student and your student's teachers. We realize making these connections will look different this year, as compared to the past. Our staff will need to rely on both in-person and virtual connections with students and their parents/guardians. We ask that you continue to be proactive in supporting those connections with our staff.

Our BHS staff are committed to making this year a success for our students, and they will put the time, energy and effort in to make it happen. We know that school looks different this fall, and may be more challenging than ever for your student. Just know our staff are doing their best to reinvent how they teach so they can be effective in our new virtual environment. Transcripts All official high school transcripts must be sent using an online transcript ordering service at www.parchment.com. Students create a profile and request to send official transcripts to any of the college or scholarship organizations needed. The cost is \$3.33 per transcript, per destination. Students that qualify for Free and Reduced lunch qualify for transcript fee waiver.

School Counselors

School Counselors work with students in a variety of areas throughout their time at Buffalo High School. Students are still able to schedule appointments with school counselors during this semester's Hybrid and Distance Learning models. School Counselors are connecting with students through in-person and virtual appointments, giving students flexibility for when and how we meet. To make an appointment, students can stop in to Student Services and request one, or they can reach out directly to their school counselor using their choice of contact information below. - 5. Click Submit!

You should receive a confirmation email shortly after your photo is successfully uploaded.
