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Good to Know

Weather Cancellations

- ◆ Community Education and ECFE classes do not meet when school is closed during the day due to weather.
- ◆ No morning ECFE classes when district 2-hour late start.
- ◆ KidKare sites remain open.

Senior 62+ Gold Card

Residents of the Buffalo-Hanover-Montrose School District, age 62 and older, are eligible for a Senior 62+ Gold Card and the following benefits:

- ◆ Attendance at most school events (band, theater, musicals, athletic events) free of charge unless designated otherwise (i.e. MSHSL Section or State events, fundraisers, etc.)
- ◆ Discount on some Community Education classes and activities. Percentage and availability differ based on activity.

School-Based Childcare




KidKare is... a school-based childcare program that extends your child's learning day while providing a safe, engaging and fun environment.

KinderKids (Age 3-5)

- ◆ Theme-based activities that support social-emotional development, academic readiness, learning through play and more.
- ◆ Offering full-day care and care for children enrolled in Bison Preschool.

School-Age (Grade K-6)

- ◆ Offering care before school, after school, and on early release days.

About Our Pool

- ◆ The pool is located at the Buffalo Community Middle School on Hwy 25. Enter door 3 (facing the football fields).
- ◆ Appropriate swimwear is required.
- ◆ Locker rooms are available.
- ◆ Pool depth ranges from 3 feet 6 inches to 12 feet.
- ◆ An adult must accompany children if under 52 inches in height.
- ◆ The use of approved life jackets/vests and other floatations are allowed when **accompanied by an adult in the water.**
- ◆ To use the deep end of the pool, swimmers must be able to swim the width of the pool using the American Red Cross Level 3 front crawl. Swimming ability will be at lifeguard discretion.
- ◆ Children are not allowed to jump off the diving boards into the arms of an adult in the water.
- ◆ Non-swimmers wishing to watch should sit in the bleacher area.
- ◆ Open swim passes available at the pool. **10 individual passes for \$40 or 10 family passes for \$90.**



Parent & Child Aquatics (6 mo to 3 yrs) \$69

Parent and child learn together to increase a child's comfort level in the water and build a foundation of basic skills, such as arm and leg movements and breath control. The two levels are fun-filled and introduce water safety.

- ◆ Change body position in the water
- ◆ Learn how to play safely
- ◆ Experience wearing a life jacket
- ◆ Expectation for adult supervision
- ◆ Enter and exit the water safely
- ◆ Submerge in a rhythmic pattern

Preschool Aquatics (4-5 years old) \$69

Children are taught basic aquatic safety, survival and swimming skills, while increasing their comfort level in and around the water. Skills are age-appropriate, helping children achieve success on a regular basis and enjoy social interactions with other children. As in all Swimming and Water Safety courses, your child will always know it's safety first.

Levels 1-5 (Height must be 52" & Age 6+) \$75

Level 1: Intro to Water Skills

Orient participants to the aquatic environment and help gain basic aquatic skills. Begin to develop positive attitudes and safe practices.

Level 2: Fundamental Aquatic Skills

Build basic aquatic skills, water safety and concepts learned in level 1.

Level 3: Stroke Development

Build on the skills learned in Levels 1 and 2 to help achieve basic water competency in a pool environment. Head first entry, survival floating and treading water will be covered.

Level 4: Stroke Improvement

Improve proficiency in performing swimming strokes introduced in Level 3. Skills include swimming front crawl 25 yards, breaststroke, back crawl and butterfly 15 yards.

Level 5: Stroke Refinement

Participants refine their performance of all six swimming strokes (front and back crawl, butterfly, breaststroke, elementary backstroke and sidestroke).

Youth Swim Lessons

Did You Know?

- Children must be 52" in height and 6 years old to participate in levels 1-5.
- Children under 52" in height and under age 6 should enroll in the Preschool level.
- The pre-requisite for each level is the successful demonstration of skills from the preceding level.
- Each level of *Learn to Swim* includes basic water safety and helping a swimmer in distress.
