## Graduation Requirements

- English- 4 credits- Required English 9, English 10 plus 2 choice credits
- Math- 3 credits Required to pass Geometry and Algebra 2
- Social Studies- 3.5 credits- Required Am. Gov't, Am. History, World St. and Econ
- Science- 3 credits- Required Phys. Science, Gen. Biology and Physics or Chemistry
- Phy. Ed.- 1.5 credits
- Health-.5 credits
- The Arts- 1 credit
- Choice credits
- Total- 30 Credits Required to Graduate

#### Senior Year Class Schedule

- You should have at least 4 CORE CLASSES
- Colleges are very sensitive to senior year course selection and grades.
- Colleges can withdraw your acceptance based on the final transcript you submit.
- If you are entering the military after high school, your options can be limited by poor performance senior year.

## Changing your schedule?

- Colleges make admission decisions based on the courses you submit to them, so...
- It is your responsibility to contact the colleges you have applied to if you are thinking about changing your schedule.
- Changing your schedule can affect admission decisions, scholarships, honors programs, etc.

## **College** Timelines

- Be aware of deadlines! Each college can have a different application deadline
- Admission notification from colleges can vary, approximately 2-4 weeks
- October 1: FAFSA (financial aid app) opens for completion
- November: Early Decision/Action Deadlines
- December/January: Most 4-year college application deadlines
- Spring: 2-year college applications due
- April: Financial aid packages are sent out
- May 1: National Notification Deadline- Decision Day!
- \*\*Watch for housing deadlines for each of your colleges

#### **College** Applications

- \*\*If you are on Free/Reduced Lunch, please inquire with your counselor about application fee waivers.
- Make an appointment with your counselor if you have questions about the application or the application process.

## **College** Applications

- Apply online- some will waive the application fee for doing so.
- Fill out the application completely.
- Read over your application for errors. Have a parent/teacher proof before submitting.
- Follow the directions for essays and short answer questions if they are required.
- Send official high school transcripts electronically via Parchment.
- Pay your application fee.
- If applying to a stretch school, additional supporting documents may be submitted (i.e. Letters of rec)

#### **College Applications- MN State**

- Star Id- an assigned ID for a student who has taken a college course at ANY <u>Mn State College</u>.
- If applying to any Mn State college and you have earned college credit by completing any CIS courses from any Mn State college:
  - Login to the application with your existing Star ID
  - > Do not create a new Star ID if you have one
  - Retrieving Star ID or resetting passwords
  - Star ID Tech Help

#### **Common Application**

- A common application to apply to more than 800 colleges in the U.S. and world
- Can save time if applying to multiple colleges that use the common app
- Search schools and deadlines:

How many years of a subject have you completed?

• Two terms of a subject = 1 credit = 1 year One term of a subject =  $\frac{1}{2}$  credit =  $\frac{1}{2}$  year

#### • For example:

American Lit/Composition (2 Terms) = 1 year of English Grammar and Usage (1 Term) = .5 year

## Letters of Recommendation

- If you need a letter of recommendation from a teacher, complete the <u>Recommendation Request Form</u> or pick one up in the Counseling Office.
- Schools prefer to receive letters from teachers of core subjects: Math, Science, Social Studies, English, and World Language.
- Do not ask more than 2 teachers.
- You should give teachers at least 2 weeks notice!
- Attach a stamped, addressed envelope to your Request for Recommendation form with a clear deadline and specific reason for the letter listed.
- Check back with the teacher prior to the deadline to remind them of the need for it to be sent.

#### **Counselor Recommendation**

- Some colleges require a counselor recommendation and will have their own form
- Download and complete a <u>Recommendation Request Form</u> or pick one up from Counseling Office
- Allow at least 2 weeks for the recommendation to be completed

## Sending BHS transcripts

- BHS utilizes an electronic transcript service called Parchment
- Create an account at <u>www.parchment.com</u>
- Indicate which schools you want your transcripts sent to and pay the processing fee
- Your transcript should be sent to that college within 48 hours
- If you have free/reduced lunches, please let your counselor know so your fee can be waived

## Sending CIS Transcripts

- Many college applications ask for official transcripts from college coursework you've completed. <u>If you have not completed your</u> <u>CIS classes, ask your college if you can wait</u> <u>until they are finished. It will save you money!</u>
- All CIS transcripts need to be sent from the college.
- List of all <u>CIS Coursework</u> at BHS with partnering colleges

## Sending CIS Transcripts (cont.)

- <u>REMEMBER!</u> All MN State colleges can see all MN State transcripts. If applying to a MN State college, you do not need to send them CIS transcripts from other MN State colleges. You would still need to send from U of M
   Follow up to make sure all credits were reviewed for transfer.

# ACT/SAT Scores for College Applications

- Most 4-year colleges require you to send your ACT and/or SAT score directly from the testing agency.
  - Part of your ACT or SAT registration includes the option to send your scores to up to 4 colleges
  - If you did not fill in colleges while completing registration, you must request your scores be sent and pay a processing fee.
- Some colleges will accept test scores from your official high school transcript. Call your college admissions office to make sure.

## Community & Technical College Testing

- After submitting your application you will sign up for an ACCUPLACER test taken on the college campus.
- Not an admission test- only class placement.
- STUDY for the test- If you score low, you will be placed in lower level or remedial classes that will not be covered by financial aid.

# ASVAB

- Measures aptitude in 4 areas: Verbal, Math, Science/Technical and Spatial
- ASVAB tests can be scheduled with a recruiter connected to your interested branch of service.

#### **Financial Aid**

- The FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) is available online beginning October 1, 2019
  - http://www.fafsa.ed.gov/
- FAFSA determines your Expected Family Contribution and compares it to the cost of college.
- Complete the FAFSA even if you do not think you will qualify for financial aid.

- Free help completing and submitting your Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).
- Items to bring: Social Security #, Drivers License #, 2018 Tax Returns of Student and Parents, Info on Savings/Assets for Student and Parents, Records of Untaxed Income
- Takes 20-30 minutes to complete

## Scholarships

- The most important source for financial aid is the FINANCIAL AID OFFICE at your colleges. Be aware of all the scholarships, grants, loans, and work-study opportunities available.
- Counseling office will send out a scholarship newsletter to your email and post on the website each month.
- Watch the monitor for scholarships available in the counseling office throughout the year.
- BHS Local Scholarship Application will be available in April.
- Check parent/guardian employers for available scholarships for families.
