Steps to assist in the Driver's Education License Process

Obtaining a Minnesota driver's license can be a bit overwhelming. Following the steps below should be helpful in navigating the process. **Keep this information for your reference through the process.**

<u>Step 1:</u> Complete 30 hours of classroom instruction with Community Education. 30-hours is mandated by the State of Minnesota if under the age of 18 years.

Step 2: Blue Card. The Blue Card indicates the student has completed 30-hours of classroom instruction and is enrolled in a Behind-the-Wheel program licensed or approved by the Department of Public Safety. The Blue Card will be given to students at the last class if they: 1) complete the course work. 2) are age 15, and 3) are enrolled for BTW with Community Education. If you paid the full fee of \$395, your student is enrolled in BTW. If not taking BTW with us, you will obtain your Blue Card from the school/business providing BTW services. Student's who are age 14 can choose to be given their Blue Card after the last class and keep it in a safe place until they turn age 15 or they can pick up their Blue Card at the Community Education office, 301 NE 2nd Ave Buffalo, M-F, 8 am-330 pm, when they turn age 15. The student must be present to sign the Blue Card.

<u>Step 3:</u> Schedule and take the Written Class D Knowledge Test. To schedule at the Wright County Government Center in Buffalo visit co.wright.mn.us and scroll down to "Make an Appointment". To schedule at a different location, visit onlineservices.dps.mn.gov (use the *Taking the Class D Knowledge Test* blue sheet as a reference). The test center will collect the **Blue Card** at your testing appointment.

<u>Step 4:</u> Wright County Government Center. After the student passes the Written Class D Knowledge Test, go to the Wright County Government Center, if you are not already there, to have their photo taken and pay the permit fee. The student will be given a temporary driver's permit and can begin supervised driving and behind-the wheel.

<u>Step 5:</u> Go in-person to the Community Education office to be assigned a Behind-the-Wheel (BTW) instructor, 301 2nd Avenue NE, Buffalo. You must bring the students temporary driver's permit. The student will be given the phone number and/or email for a BTW instructor. The student will schedule their 6-hours of BTW directly with the instructor. Typically, one-hour of BTW is scheduled per month for six months. In between, the student will practice driving skills with their parent/guardian.

<u>Step 6:</u> Schedule the Road Test. After the student has completed 3 hours of BTW, schedule the Road Test. To schedule at the Wright County Test Center visit co.wright.mn.us and scroll down to "Make an Appointment". To schedule at a different location, visit onlineservices.dps.mn.gov (use the Road Test Procedure Information yellow sheet as a reference). To take the Road Test, students must be age 16, have their Instructional Permit for a minimum of 180 days, complete 6-hours of behind-the-wheel (BTW) and log 50 hours of parent supervised driving.
