Make-Up Session:

One make-up session is scheduled for **Friday, February 7, 3:35 – 6:35 pm, in Room A107 at Buffalo High School**. Tardies and/or absence from one class need to be made-up. Students needing more than 3-hours of make-up time will be withdrawn and the student will need to REPEAT ALL THIRTY HOURS of the classroom instruction. The classroom portion of the fee is \$110. An additional \$110 fee is required to repeat the classroom instruction. **We encourage you to check for schedule conflicts prior to registering.**

Instruction Permit Test:

The MN Department of Public Safety will be at Buffalo High School (Room A107) **Monday, February 10, 2020 at 3:35 pm** to administer the written instruction permit for students who are 15 years old by February 10, 2020 and successfully met all requirements of the Winter 2020 classroom instruction by the end of class. Students not yet age 15 will take the written instruction permit at a exam station when they turn age 15.

## **BHM Community Education Classroom Policies**

### **Driver Education (Page 3)**

- 1.) Suspended/truant students may not attend classroom instruction.
- 2.) Students must be in attendance for 30 hours of classroom instruction (State Law for students under 18 years of age) and must be completed/passed on or before the last day of class.
- 3.) Students who have tardies and/or absence from one class should plan to attend the scheduled make-up session. The first scheduled class must be attended.
- 4.) We offer one 3-hour make-up session. Students needing more than 3-hours of make-up time will be withdrawn and must REPEAT ALL THIRTY HOURS of the classroom instruction. **An additional \$110 fee is required to repeat the classroom instruction.**
- 5.) Students who are absent from one class are expected to have the next class assignment done when returning to class as well as the assignment due on the day of the absence.
- 6.) Students should bring class materials (textbook, workbook, manual, black pen, pencil and highlighter) to every class session.
- 7.) Students need to average 70% or higher on assignments, quizzes and tests (indicating they have successfully completed the classroom) and paid the Driver Education class fee in full to receive their INSTRUCTION PERMIT or BLUE CARD.
- 8.) Students with some or all of the assignment not done when corrected with the class will be scored as incorrect.
- 9.) Students cannot use electronic devices during class.
- 10.) Food or drink are not allowed in the classroom or on carpeted areas.
- 11.) There is ZERO TOLERANCE for students with a chemical violation or unlawful action during classroom instruction. Students will be dropped from classroom instruction without a refund.
- 12.) Students should adhere to school campus rules.
- 13.) Please help keep the room, hallways and lavatories clean.
- 14.) The need for disciplinary action could result in expulsion from the Drivers Education program.
- 15.) Students should demonstrate a positive and serious attitude for this rigorous classroom instruction.
- 16.) Students must meet all requirements to pass the classroom instruction.
- 17.) Students should leave the building within 15 minutes after class.

**M.S.171.04, subd. 1: The department shall not issue a driver's license to any person who is under the age of 18 years unless the person had applied for, been issued, and possessed the appropriate instruction permit *for a minimum of six months.***
