Open Enrollment

If you live outside the BHM District, you can open enroll into our schools. Call 763.682.8737.

Count Yourself In!

If your child is between the ages of birth and 5 years, please call 763.682.8737 to get registered on the district census. This ensures that you are notified about early childhood screening and kindergarten registration at the appropriate times.

Early Childhood Family Education (ECFE)

ECFE provides parent and early childhood education for families with children ages birth to kindergarten, as well as expectant parents. Parents and children can participate in classes, discussion groups, home visits, special events and preschool classes.

Early Childhood Screening

Minnesota law requires every child to participate in early childhood screening prior to starting kindergarten. The screening checks hearing, height and weight, speech and language, cognitive processing and large and fine motor skills. Completed between the ages of 3–4 years, screening can help identify potential issues that

may affect development and learning. Early Childhood Special Education is available for students birth to age 6 who qualify for additional support.

Early childhood screening is by appointment only throughout the school year. To make an appointment, call 763.682.8780.

Choose from Our Top-Rated ECFE Preschool Programs

Our **Spring Into Preschool** and **Ready Set Grow** programs have earned the highest 4-Star Rating from MN Parent Aware. These ECFE preschool classes are taught by licensed teachers, with an assistant in each classroom. Because parents are the child's first and most important teacher, parent involvement is a major component of our programs.

Select a preschool class based on your child's age as of September 1. Financial assistance is available for those who qualify.

Spring Into Preschool

(Ages 2.5-3.5 Years)

This preschool option meets once a week and is offered as a 9-month, 28-session class or a 5-month, 15-session class. The program supports social/ emotional development through age-appropriate activities designed for our youngest learners. This program meets weekly, for 1.5 hours. Monthly parent education sessions are offered to provide education and support.

Ready Set Grow Preschool

(Ages 3–5 Years)

This 9-month, 30-week preschool experience is offered 2 to 5 days per week. The teachers will help nurture your child's social emotional development and use research-based curriculum to focus on language, literacy, math, scientific thinking, and building academic skills to prepare your child for kindergarten.

All BHM preschool classes are integrated and serve children of all abilities.



Childcare Options

KidKare provides quality before- and after-school childcare and age-appropriate enrichment activities for students in kindergarten through grade 6 at all elementary school locations (Discovery students are served at Parkside).

KidKare options also are available for children ages 3–5 at Tatanka Elementary STEM School, Hanover, Parkside and Northwinds (Discovery children are served at Parkside). Families can choose either a full-day, half-day or wrap-around care for those enrolled in a preschool program.

KidKare is open year-round, except for major holidays. All sites are open 6 a.m.–6:30 p.m.



Get Ready for Kindergarten

We understand that kindergarten is an important step for children and families. At BHM Schools, we want your child to be ready for success in school. The following skills, while not required, are helpful indicators of kindergarten readiness.

Social & Emotional

- Interacts positively with others
- Participates in activities and stays on task for 15 minutes or longer
- Copes easily without crying and regulates emotions and behaviors

Language & Literacy

- Writes name and begins to identify upper and lower case letters
- Uses scribbles, shapes, pictures or dictation to represent ideas and thoughts
- Follows directions involving two or three steps

Math & Science

- Counts objects in small groups
- Recognizes and creates simple patterns
- Identifies shapes and colors

Physical Development

- Shows independence with self-help skills such as washing hands, toileting, zipping, tying shoes and eating
- Draws a person with body parts
- Demonstrates large muscle control by hopping, balancing, and throwing and catching a ball

Grade Level Expectations

The expectations outlined below describe the learning goals that kindergarten students should meet by the end of the school year. Families can help their children meet these expectations by making sure they come to school ready to learn and by taking an interest in schoolwork they bring home.

Language Arts

- Identify letter names and letter sounds
- Rhyme words
- Write words that are common
- Read 50 high frequency words
- Ask and answer questions about stories and other text
- Tell the beginning, middle and end of short stories
- Learn to read easy books
- Learn to form capital and lowercase letters
- Tell a story with words and pictures
- Follow two-step directions
- Gain meaning by listening to a speaker, video or story

Math

- Sort and classify objects by color, size, thickness or other attributes
- Tell the position and location of objects
- Orally count with and without objects
- Write and read numbers to 31
- Identify 2D and 3D shapes such as squares, cylinders and pyramids
- Explore fractions
- · Identify what is first, second and third
- Identify months, days and dates on a calendar

Science

- Observe changes in nature
- Classify objects into groups (things found in nature verses human-made)
- Understand how people can make and use things from the environment

Social Studies

- Learn about living in the U.S.
- Explore globes and maps
- Learn why rules are helpful

Health

 Learn about healthy eating, expressing feelings and identifying safe behaviors

Art

 Explore a variety of art forms such as drawing, painting and sculpting

Info to Know

Immunizations

Minnesota Immunization Law states that all students must submit an updated immunizations status before starting kindergarten. These include immunization record, notarized non-medical exemption form or physician signed medical exemption form.

Required shots:

- 5—Diptheria/Tetanus/Pertussis (DTaP)
- 4—Polio
- 3—Hepatitis B (HBV)
- 2—Measles/Mumps/Rubella (MMR)
- 2—Varicella (Chicken Pox)

Illness Attendance Policy

A child should stay home from school when he/she is experiencing any of the following: a temperature of 100.5 degrees or more, vomiting or diarrhea. Students should not return to school until fever free (without medications) or symptom free for 24 hours after the last episode. After contagious illnesses such as impetigo or strep throat, children can return 12-24 hours after antibiotic treatment, depending on type of illness.

Medication in School

Most medications are administered through the school's health office. Written authorization for the medication is required from the child's parent and physician (if prescription medication). Medications must be in the labeled prescription bottle or in the original over-the counter container. We strongly encourage parents to deliver the medications directly to the health office.

Transportation

Vision Transportation of Buffalo provides bus service for BHM Schools. Families

can designate up to one alternate location such as daycare or a relative's house for pick-up and drop-off.

School Start and End Times

All elementary schools start at 7:45 a.m. and end at 2:25 p.m.

Nutrition Services

FREE breakfast is available to ALL kindergarten students before school beginning at 7:25 a.m. Students may either purchase meals through the district's nutrition services program or bring a lunch from home. Information is available to determine if your child qualifies for free or reduced meal prices on the parent portal.

Special Education Services

Buffalo-Hanover-Montrose School District provides special education and related services to students birth to 21 who qualify under eligibility criteria established by the State of Minnesota. The district provides students a free and appropriate public education in the least restrictive environment. Parents are involved in all planning activities related to their child's individualized education plan. The continuum of services available in the district allows for student plans to be tailored to individual strengths and needs. Administration and staff are committed to providing high quality learning opportunities for all students, always striving to create positive experiences while working toward achieving individual student goals.

Staying Connected

Principals and teachers regularly communicate with families. All elementary schools and the district have Facebook pages to post photos and upcoming events. A parent portal is used to provide parents with timely information about their child such as attendance, meal account balance, report cards and testing information. The district and schools also use a parent notification system to alert parents of important dates and school delays or cancellations.

Register for Kindergarten

Children who are 5 years old by September 1 are eligible to enroll in kindergarten. Each school has a Kindergarten Registration Night in February or March. You will meet the principal and teachers, turn in registration materials and hear more information about what to expect in kindergarten, transportation, childcare, nutrition services and more.

If you are enrolling in kindergarten after the registration night, contact your neighborhood school for more information or go online to bhmschools.org and click on "Get Ready for Kindergarten." In addition to the registration and health emergency forms, you will need to submit:

- A copy of your child's birth certificate
- Up-to-date immunization records
- Open Enrollment form if enrolling from outside of the district and early childhood screening documents.
