GREETINGS ALL BCMS FAMILIES!

With only about two weeks left, we are wrapping up another great year here at Buffalo Community Middle School. Along with an amazing staff, who genuinely care about your child and the supportive community that we serve, we continue to strive for greatness at BCMS. We have completed all of our MCA testing and truly appreciate your support at home and the efforts of your students in making this another successful testing season.

Our leadership team met on May 15 to review this past year and plan for the 2019-2020 school year. During part of our meeting time, we took on the task of creating a common instructional framework for the classrooms in our school, as well as, building-wide culture non-negotiables. We will continue to keep student cell phones out of the classrooms to help students stay focused on the material in front of them. We will also continue to have a zipper "Case-it" binder for all students, with common supplies inside. Once again, all student supplies will be packaged together for you to purchase in August. After having many issues with this year's new physical binder, we will be going back to the style that we had two years ago.

The transition from elementary to middle school is an important one, so we are excited to continue with our second year of staggered start dates for the start of the 2019-2020 school year. On Tuesday, September 3, 2019, only sixth graders will attend BCMS. That will give sixth grade students an opportunity to get comfortable with middle school, without hundreds of other students being in the mix. Last year, this change replaced "Middle School 101" and the "WEB Day" that had been summer programs offered to incoming sixth grade students. In 2018-2019, this was a great opportunity for all incoming sixth graders to become acclimated to the middle school!

Once again, thanks for all of your support this past school year. When we have parental and community support, our committed staff members are able to create the best possible learning environment for your children.

WEB - Where Everyone Belongs

Coming to the middle school for the first time can be an overwhelming experience. For sixth graders at Buffalo Community Middle School, Where Everybody Belongs, or the WEB program, has been instrumental in removing the intimidation factor.

On the first day of school, the entire incoming sixth grade class participates in a WEB orientation program. This orientation includes trained eighth grade WEB leaders facilitating highly structured, fun, small group activities aimed at making sixth graders feel more comfortable and connected to BCMS. The overall goal of the program is to make the transition to middle school the most welcoming and positive experience possible.

This summer 92 eighth grade students will participate in an intensive training where they will learn to lead sixth grade students in building relationships, creating a school culture of learning, as well as how to belong and positively impact our BCMS family. Additionally, these leaders will continue training throughout the school year and have monthly opportunities to interact with their assigned group of sixth grade students. Our eighth grade leaders make it their mission to be positive role models for not only the sixth graders, but for all students in the building.

Last year was the first year that BCMS experienced WEB Orientation on the first day of the school year! Our staff was able to welcome, teach, support and guide the sixth graders during their transition to the Buffalo Community Middle School. In addition, this day provided each sixth grade student an opportunity to settle in with his/her WEB leaders prior to joining the large community of learners at BCMS.



BCMS New Academic Thursday

BCMS students have been using flexible learning opportunities during Academic Thursdays to receive more time on essential standards. This time was previously set aside as Academic Time from 8:50-9:10 on Thursdays during Prime Time. With the new setup, students are able to get what they need, with the teachers they need, all during the school day, without being pulled from other academic classes. Students are given the opportunity to sign up, or be assigned by a teacher, to receive additional time and support in current curriculum. Examples of Academic Thursday Session classes have included: test retaking opportunities, AVID binder organization, reteaching from being absent, and silent reading time. BCMS will continue to offer flexible learning opportunities in the 2019-2020 school year to extend and enrich learning opportunities.



BCMS History Day Students at State!

This year, Buffalo Community Middle School had 45 students participate in the Minnesota National History Day Competition held the at University of Minnesota on Saturday, May 4. Students created websites, documentaries, performances and exhibits to showcase their research about a topic and connect it to the theme: *Triumph and Tragedy in History*. Students did extensive research, analyzed primary sources, learned different skills related to both research, collaboration and project creation! This year we had 16 students go onto state! 8th Grade Valleyfair Field Trip

On Friday, May 31, 2019 BCMS is celebrating the completion of middle school for our eighth grade students with a trip to Valleyfair in Shakopee, MN. This is the 29th annual 8th grade Valleyfair event.

Plans are to leave the school at 9:00am and return to BCMS at 4:00pm. All buses will return students to Buffalo Community Middle School.

Students are asked to pay \$26.00 to offset the cost of bus, admission and most rides. Food, merchandise, Challenge Park and some games require extra money. Lunches and snacks will be at student's expense. The remainder of the fee and transportation costs will be paid for from the money raised in this year's fundraiser. For students on free lunches, the fee will be waived; those on reduced lunches can pay \$13.00 or students with a season pass will need to pay \$6 for the bus.

Student conduct, expected both at Valleyfair and at school prior to the trip, has been discussed with students. Student eligibility to attend Valleyfair is determined by administration through academic and behavior criteria. Students are expected to have their school work in order, with a minimum of tardies, absences and discipline referrals to be able to participate. Students will be notified if they are not allowed to attend. Our hope is that all students are able to enjoy a class day at Valleyfair.

2019-2020 Opt Out

2019-2020 Release of Student Data for Buffalo-Hanover-Montrose Schools **NEW information included. Please read carefully!

According to the Minnesota Data Practices Act and the Federal Family Educational Right and Privacy Act (FERPA), student directory information is public unless a parent requests that the information not be released. Parents who do not want any portion of their child's data released for the 2019-2020 school year must use this form to notify their child's school, before the start of the school year. Annually, parents can choose to opt out of any or all three categories listed below. If you have questions, you may contact the school your child attends.

1. Student Directory Information

Parents may choose to opt out of the release of all student directory information, or they may select specific areas to not have the data released. The primary purpose of directory information is to allow

BHM to include this type of information from your child's education records in certain school publications. Examples include, but are not limited to:

- Playbills showing your student's role in a drama production
- Graduation programs
- Yearbook
- · Sports/activity programs
- · Honor roll or other recognition lists

Special NOTE: By opting out of the student name portion of the student information (seen below), you will be opting out of such examples as those listed above (yearbook, programs, honor roll, etc.).

**2. Photos/Video Transmissions

Throughout the year, photographs and video are taken in classrooms and at school activities that happen during the school day. Photos or videos may be used in some of the following examples, but are not limited to:

- District publications (Insider, calendar, etc.)
- Other educational organizations
- Yearbooks
- Cable access channel(s)
- School newsletters/newspapers
- Website/Facebook/Twitter
- Local/area newspapers
- Photo classroom composite page (included in "picture day" packets)

**Photos can be published on the district website with the student's name. Unless you have opted out of your child's name being released as a part of the student directory information section above, it can be used online.

Special NOTE: By opting out of photos/video transmissions you will be opting out of ALL items listed above. Also note that the district is not responsible for (has no control of) photos/video, taken by the public, at school public events (such as basketball games or homecoming coronation), which are published in newspapers or aired for viewing on cable or the web.

3. Military and Post Secondary Educational Institution Recruitment (Applies to students in grades 11-12 ONLY.)

Each year the military and post secondary institutions ask high schools to provide names, addresses, phone numbers and emails of students in grades 11-12 for recruitment purposes. They provide information to students about education and career opportunities.


